REGISTRATION NOW OPEN for Family-to-Family and Peer-to-Peer classes

Family-to-Family is a free 12-week course for family caregivers of individuals with severe mental illnesses that discusses the clinical treatment of these illnesses and teaches the knowledge and skills that family members need to cope more effectively. The Family-to-Family class will begin on **Tuesday nights, September 6th**, from 6:30 to 9:00 pm.

Peer-to-Peer Education Course is a free ten week – 2-1/2 hours per week – experiential education course on the topic of recovery for any person with serious mental illness who is interested in establishing and maintaining wellness. The course uses a combination of lecture, interactive exercises and structured group processes. The diversity of experience among course participants affords for a lively dynamic that moves the course along. The Peer-to-Peer class will begin on **Sunday afternoons, September 18th**, from 1:00 to 3:30 pm.

NAMI Basics is a free six-week course for family caregivers of children and adolescents who have either been diagnosed with a serious mental illness / serious disturbance or who are experiencing symptoms but have not yet been diagnosed. This free course is taught by trained NAMI members. The next Basics class will begin in **January, 2012**.

David Letterman opens up about depression

Technorati—Late-night TV host David Letterman knows depression is no laughing matter. In a rare interview which aired again recently, Letterman told interviewer Barbara Walters that he recognizes the difference among sadness, the blues, depression, and clinical depression because he’s lived it.

Walters asked Letterman, host of CBS’ Late Show With David Letterman, whether he’s taking medication for depression. He responded that he gets “medicinal help,” though he didn’t identify what type of antidepressant he’s taking. He also told Walters that severe depression is “horrifying.”

“I know what depression is. Depression is a black hole,” Letterman said.

During Letterman’s interview with Walters, the 63-year-old comedian talked primarily about his open-heart surgery in 2000. After the surgery, he said, “I would find myself busting into tears and sobbing uncontrollably with joy.”

Appearing in 2010 on Live with Regis and Kelly, Letterman said the sex scandal surrounding his workplace affairs had triggered depression. At the time, Letterman said he was putting the pieces of his life back together.
