The Dangers of Stigma

Yolanda Stephen will be our guest speaker in October, addressing "the dangers of stigma" in regard to mental illness.

Yolanda Stephen is a Georgia native and former flight attendant. In addition to writing and speaking to youth and women's groups, sharing her story of betrayal and renewed faith, she also creates training and marketing materials for a Fortune 500 company.

When Ms. Stephen got married, she could not have envisioned some of the challenges she was about to face with the love of her life. Little did she know that his poor mental health and emotional issues were about to take her down a rollercoaster ride that would rattle her whole world. Yolanda is brutally honest in her account of her marriage to her husband in her recently published memoir, "The Upside of the Down Low - A pastor's wife's memoir." www.upsidebook.com. It is a riveting page turner which addresses the issues she had to deal with in her marriage . . . depression, financial woes, lies, sexual infidelity, sexuality and suicide. It is also a story of her resilience in the face of incredible challenges.

Her book serves as a cautionary tale and highlights some of the dangers of ignoring serious emotional issues and not getting help for mental illness. It also deals with the huge stigma that exists when it comes to mental illness and homosexuality, a stigma that's exponentially higher in the black community.

REGISTRATION (Waiting List) for Family-to-Family, Peer-to-Peer and Basics classes

Family-to-Family is a free 12-week course for family caregivers of individuals with severe mental illnesses that discusses the clinical treatment of these illnesses and teaches the knowledge and skills that family members need to cope more effectively. The Family-to-Family class will begin in **January, 2012**

Peer-to-Peer Education Course is a free ten week – 2-1/2 hours per week – experiential education course on the topic of recovery for any person with serious mental illness who is interested in establishing and maintaining wellness. The course uses a combination of lecture, interactive exercises and structured group processes. The diversity of experience among course participants affords for a lively dynamic that moves the course along. The Peer-to-Peer class will begin in **January, 2012**

NAMI Basics is a free six-week course for family caregivers of children and adolescents who have either been diagnosed with a serious mental illness / serious disturbance or who are experiencing symptoms but have not yet been diagnosed. This free course is taught by trained NAMI members. The NAMI Basics class will begin in **January, 2012**
